Along with the champagnes, our Italian sparkling wines are made according to the rigorous “Metodo Classico” production process, with second fermentation in the bottle and over 36 months refinement and ageing on the lees. This is not to be confused with your mass produced 11% “prosecco”. This is a 12.5% fine sparkling wine.

With a delicate pale pink colour and an elegant nose of acacia flowers, this light-bodied dry rose is delightfully refreshing, simple and delicious. <i>Pinot Grigio Veneto 12%</i>

From the ‘Maremma Toscana’ terroir, this rose has a pink peach blossom colour with a good freshness and an intriguing and pleasant nose, with fruity notes reminiscent of pomegranate, pink grapefruit, wild strawberries, green apple and pear. <i>Sangiovese Toscana 12%</i>

Castel Firmian Sauvignon Blanc From a state-of-the-art winery handling estate-grown fruit from its extensive vineyard holdings in the heart of the Dolomites, this Sauvignon has a dry, citrusy and rounded palate with a delicately mineral finish, it is typical Trentino. <i>Sauvignon Blanc Trentino-Alto Adige 12%</i>	7.5	10	30

The Cotarella family name is inherently linked to some of Italy's finest wines. Riccardo Cotarella is one of the country's most revered wine making consultants, and his brother Renzo is the long standing chief winemaker at Antinori. Together they founded the Falesco winery in Lazio in 1979, with the goal of showcasing local varieties that had fallen from favour. This wine combines bright stone fruit and crisp green apple flavours with hints of spice, and a subtle mineral note to complement the richly textured mid-palate.

From the early 90s, Jermann transcended from visionary to icon. With over 30 Tre Bicchieri awards from the Gambero Rosso guide, Jermann is rightly recognised as one of Italy's finest producers. This white involves being aged in Slavonian oak barrels for 6 months. It has a lively and vibrant expression of medium intensity, full of fresh and fruity notes.

<p>This grape variety is referred to as Syrah in the 'old world' and Shiraz in the 'new world'. Bold and spicy with opulent notes of wild berries, black pepper and thyme, offering a fresh acidity perfectly framed by the lush, velvety tannins.</p> <p><i>Syrah Sicilia 13.5%</i></p>

<p>A great vibrant ruby red with loads of character and a real special treat. It is intense and full-bodied with a complex flavour of spicy notes, hints of eucalyptus, sweet fruit and a fragrant scent of oak.</p> <p><i>Cabernet Sauvignon Trentino-Alto Adige 13%</i></p>

<p>Made using a tradition dating back 1,500 years. This wine is dark ruby red with an ample complexity and a real elegant velvety finish that anybody who knows Amarone will appreciate.</p> <p><i>Molinara, Rondinella, Corvina Veneto 15%</i></p>			
Barolo Prunotto			79
<p>This wine needs no introduction. Everyone knows Barolo, for good reason. It is a fabulous intense garnet red wine with notes of rose, strawberry and forest fruits; delicately perfumed yet persistent on the palate. The best wine from Piemonte, this is Barolo at its best.</p> <p><i>Nebbiolo Piemonte 14%</i></p>

<p>Morellino di Scansano</p> <p>A wine of intense colour and full-bodied, offering an attractive spicy aroma and a generous flavour with a hint of blackberry and blackcurrant to the nose.</p> <p><i>Sangiovese Toscana 14%</i></p>	36
<p>Achelo Cortona DOC</p> <p>An intense ruby-purple, full-flavoured and delicate wine with a complex pepper and tobacco nose. It has a supple texture and sweet palate, with a pleasurable persistence that highlights its fruity after-taste rich in aromas of dark fruit, blackcurrants, blackberry jam and light hints of vanilla, as well as the typical spicy herbal finish of Tuscany.</p> <p><i>Sprah, Merlot Toscana 14%</i></p>	38
<p>Vino Nobile di Montepulciano</p> <p>The noblest wine of Tuscany, many would argue the best. This particular estate is near Valliano, my father's birthplace. In this region, Sangiovese grapes are called 'Prugnolo Gentile' due to their superior quality. If you enjoy red wine, this is a must. It's full-bodied, rich with a degree of warm spice, and lingering on the palate.</p> <p><i>Sangiovese, Merlot Toscana 14.5%</i></p>	51
<p>Chianti Classico Riserva</p> <p>The best known wine in Tuscany. Villa Antinori began life as a Chianti Classico Riserva in 1928, and with the 2011 vintage reinstated this iconic wine within the range. This is a rich modern Chianti that marries beautifully ripe cherry fruit with well-judged smokey oak notes. The opulence on the palate is tempered by savoury notes of clove and a firm structure supporting the plump fruit.</p> <p><i>Sangiovese, Merlot Toscana 14%</i></p>	54
<p>Brunello di Montalcino</p> <p>The king of wines. The beautiful hill-town of Montalcino has its vineyards 480 metres above sea level, which allows it to produce this very elegant Brunello, from handpicked sangiovese grapes. Aged in oak barrels for thirty months, it has an intense fragrance of red fruits and well-rounded tannins. Simply the best.</p> <p><i>Sangiovese Toscana 14%</i></p>	94
<p>Tignanello 2019</p> <p>Tignanello is considered one of the first of the modern Super Tuscan wines, originating from the prestigious Italian winery Marchesi Antinori, and has decisively shaped Italian viticulture. The 2019 Tignanello offers exceptional complexity on the nose, with red fruits, strawberries and pomegranate that lead onto aromas of apricot and peach, finishing with vanilla, chocolate, spicy nutmeg and mediterranean herbs. The palate is graceful with silky tannins, liveliness and length, whilst roasted coffee and bitter chocolate linger on the finish.</p> <p><i>Sangiovese, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc Toscana 14.5%</i></p>	220

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
